We are looking for an instructor to teach the Acting for Film modules (6 sessions + 1 instructor transition class) for our new Acting for Stage and Film class (Ages 14-18). The contractor will work independently but in communication with the Theatre Acting instructor who is currently working with the same class in separate theatre technique sessions. Working closely with the Education Manager and the Education Co-ordinator, Instructors teach acting and ensemble-building skills for Acting classes. The Film-acting instructor will focus on techniques for acting on camera. Curriculum is created in concert with the Education Manager. Our classes are delivered in-person with a max of 12 to 15 students per class.

Responsibilities will include

- Planning, preparing and delivering lessons to all students in the class
- Teaching according to the educational needs, abilities and achievement of the individual students and group of students
- Communicating, consulting and co-operating with other staff members,
- Communicating and coordinating with the Theatre Acting instructor
- Safeguarding the students' health and safety at all times
- Occasional Faculty meetings, as needed
